The National Commission for Minorities celebrated the Minority Day on December 18th 2024. The United Nations on December 18, 1992 adopted and broadcast the Statement on the individual's Rights belonging to Religious or Linguistic National or Ethnic Minorities. The Hon'ble Minister of State for Ministry of Minority Affairs, Shri George Kurian graced the function as the Chief Guest which was presided over by Shri Iqbal Singh Lalpura, Chairman, National Commission for Minorities.
